## **Council Members**

- There is a total of *four* vacancies for elected membership of Council:  
*Three* of these are for the normal term of three years, i.e. from May 2025 to May 2028; *one* is to fill a casual vacancy for one year from May 2025 to May 2026.

## **Archdeaconry Synod Representatives**

- Archdeaconry Synod Representatives are elected on a common three-year cycle and there are currently no vacancies. The current three-year cycle runs from April 2023 until April 2026.

## **Wardens**

Church Wardens are elected for a one year term of office, and may be elected for six consecutive years before they must stand down. Nominees wishing to stand for election as a Church Warden should discuss this with the chaplain or existing wardens in advance of completing the application form.

## **Electoral Roll**

\*Under the Church Representation Rules and Holy Trinity's Constitution people are entitled to have their names on the Electoral Roll if they:

- (i) are baptized and aged 16 or over
- (ii) are a member of the Church of England (or of a Church in communion with the Church of England) and have my name entered on the electoral roll of a parish or chaplaincy in the Provinces of Canterbury or York
- (iii) are a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with the Church of England, have habitually attended public worship in the chaplaincy during the preceding six months
- (iv) are a member in good standing of a Church which is not in communion with the Church of England but subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity, and are also member of the Church of England and have habitually attended public worship in the chaplaincy during the preceding six months.
